

## BANFF/KICKING HORSE

March 6—13, 2008

Snowboarders and skiers will love our trip to Canada's famous Banff National Park area. We will be based in Banff at the Inns of Banff hotel. Our accommodations were booked with the ability to upgrade your room if you wish to do so. It's a short 12-minute walk into the central business district or, if the weather isn't perfect, then simply jump aboard one of their convenient shuttles. There are 2 restaurants on the premises as well as a heated outdoor pool, indoor pool, hot tub and ski rental shop.

The package includes a 4 out of 5-day lift ticket to any one of the three major ski areas in Banff. Lake Louise, Mt. Norquay and Sunshine Village are a short free bus ride from town. Our package also includes a 1-day lift ticket and transportation to Canada's newest ski area, Kicking Horse Resort. Kicking Horse will hold special appeal to advanced intermediates or experts as it has 70 inbound chutes. No need to traverse the backcountry, just stay inbounds and enjoy the spectacular terrain and scenery. There is also ample beginner terrain as well as the highest restaurant in all of Canada. What a view!



## BIG SKY, MT



Moonlight Basin

Originally the brain child of NBC news anchor Chet Huntley, Big Sky Resort is a sprawling 3,812 skiable acre ski resort that epitomizes great skiing. Topping out at 11,166 feet, Lone Peak has something for all skiers. The tree-skiing is unmatched, the chutes and couloirs so steep they're monitored by ski patrol at all times, the powder is deep, lines are non-existent and the groomers are epic. Seriously, it has all this and more.

Currently owned by Boyne USA (the same folks that just bought Sugarloaf and Sunday River), Big Sky has teamed up with Moonlight Basin to offer the most skiable acres under one lift ticket in the US (5,512 acres). Moonlight Basin is a big resort with even bigger aspirations. The base lodge is currently a temporary building and bathrooms are limited to portable toilets, but the skiing is unreal. Consuming the back third of Lone Peak, Moonlight has its own character and some features not offered by Big Sky. Their chutes are drop-in and don't require hiking. They're also a little safer and are good for strong intermediates, thereby eliminating the need for avalanche gear and ski patrol-monitored gate access. Tree-skiing abounds on the backside and you're welcome to drop in pretty much anywhere you'd like. Moonlight is a young, growing resort that will see some serious improvements in the future.

Bud Shaw and I traveled to Big Sky late March 2007 to see these two resorts for ourselves. A recent storm had just salvaged their spring season which provided us with some great skiing. Bud, being a Big Sky Veteran and I, a newbie to the area, found the Big Sky base area to be as we suspected—a little sparse. There are a few good restaurants that more than meet one's après needs and there are some good lodging choices as well; however, this is far from the likes of Killington's access road. There is talk of rebuilding the base area to create a more attractive package for skiers of all demographics. You can naturally expect that upgrade to bring more crowds, something Big Sky is completely void of now. While we were there, I didn't see much else offered in the way of attractions. But, with over 5,500 acres of terrain above, what else do you want?

Bud and I both found Moonlight Basin to be the more enjoyable resort. The skiing seemed better thanks to a more favorable northern exposure. Staff and patrollers were more eager to please and they were excited about the inevitable upcoming improvements to their own side of the mountain. One patroller told me they plan on topping Whistler-Blackcomb for skiable acreage someday. This is entirely possible—Chet Huntley selected Lone Peak partially because it is entirely housed on private property, not Federal property. When I mentioned my preference for Moonlight to the Big Sky staff, they stated Big Sky features similar terrain as Moonlight, it just wasn't open at the time. That is probably true, but it shows Moonlight might be able to keep snow on terrain Big Sky can't.

On our last night in Montana, Bud and I wandered into yet another spring storm to get dinner. That night, we joked about getting snowed in—something I think everyone jokes about when traveling out west. This time, it actually happened. The road to the airport was closed, so we had to stay and ski an extra day in waist deep powder. Tragic. Watch for this trip to be offered by the club in coming seasons!
